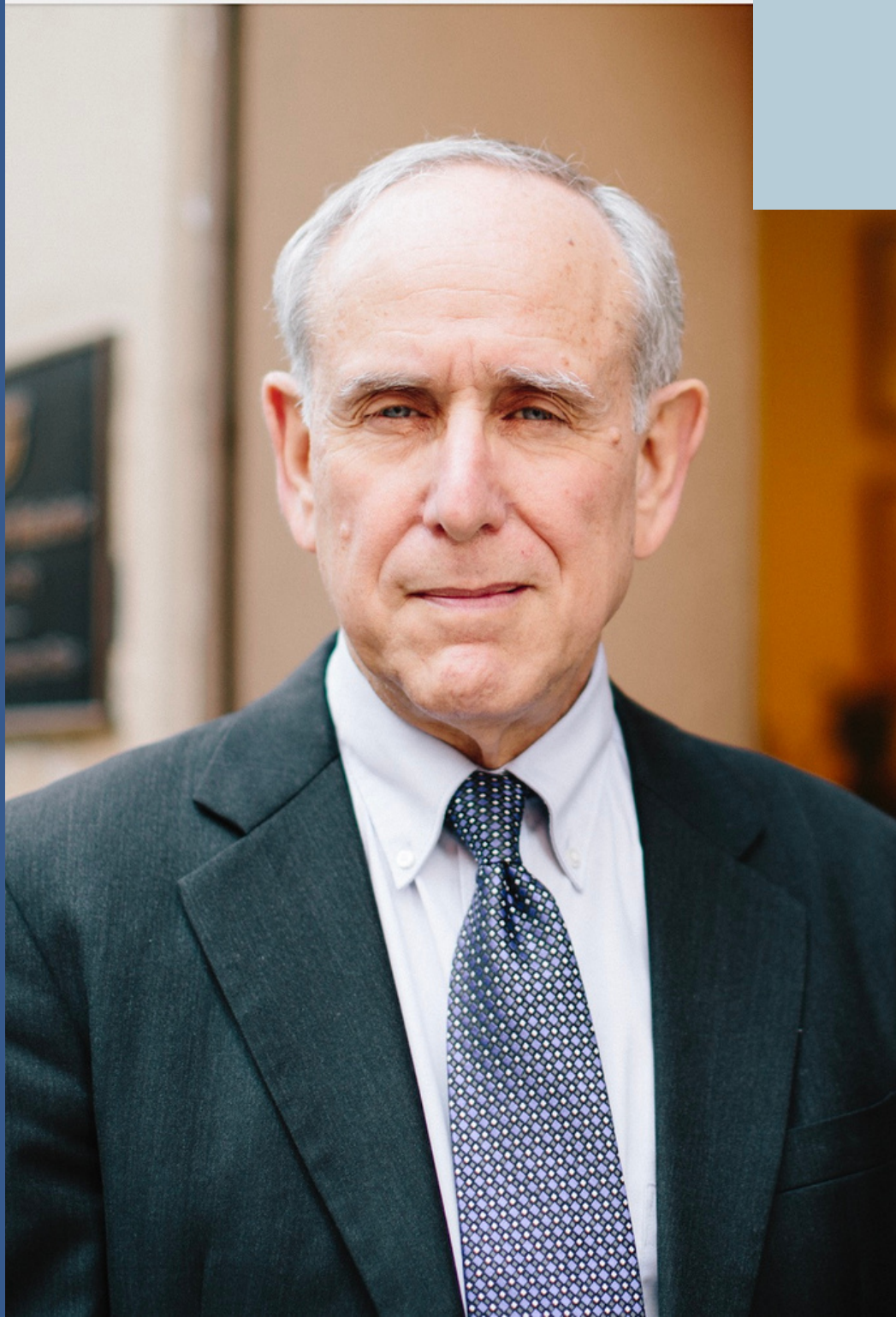

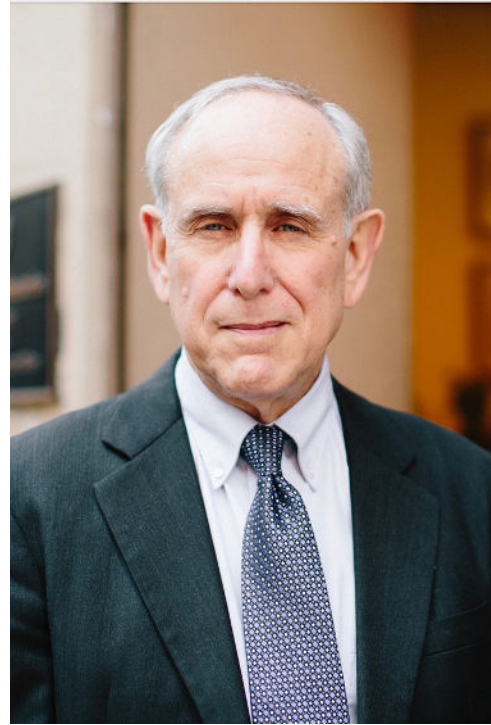

Dr. Mitch Glaser

President

Born into a nominally Orthodox Jewish home in New York City, Dr. Mitch Glaser grew up during a time when major changes were happening in American society around views on life, death, and religion. Dr. Glaser lost his religious roots shortly after his Bar Mitzvah at age thirteen to the excitement and energy of the 1960s.

Dr. Glaser moved to California after dropping out of college in 1970. There, he was introduced to various Eastern religions that, although he found fascinating, did not answer the deepest questions of his soul. He first heard the gospel message following a friend's decision to accept Jesus as her Messiah, which led him to receive Jesus himself in November 1970. Almost immediately after becoming a believer, Dr. Glaser became involved with what was then the West Coast branch of Chosen People Ministries (formerly known as the American Board of Missions to the Jews), marking the start of a forty-five-year ministry. Since 1997, Dr. Glaser has served as president of Chosen People Ministries—one of the oldest and largest Messianic missions in the United States.



An alumnus of Northeastern Bible College, Dr. Glaser also holds a Master of Divinity degree in Old Testament from Talbot School of Theology as well as a PhD in Intercultural Studies from Fuller Theological Seminary, School of Intercultural Studies. He is the co-author of *The Fall Feasts of Israel* with his wife Zhava and co-editor of *To the Jew First*, *The Gospel According to Isaiah 53*, *The People, The Land and The Future of Israel*, *Messiah in the Passover*, and *Israel, the Church, and the Middle East*, all published by Kregel Publications. Dr. Glaser's evangelistic book, *Isaiah 53 Explained*, is now in fifteen languages with more than 200,000 copies in print. He has written many articles for Christian periodicals and has taught at leading evangelical schools such as Talbot School of Theology, Fuller Theological Seminary, Moody Bible Institute, and Columbia International University.

Dr. Glaser is married to Zhava and they have two daughters, Miriam and Jenni.

Dr. Mitch Glaser

A self-professed “unlikely person to believe in Jesus,” Dr. Mitch Glaser was born into a nominally Orthodox Jewish home in New York City. He grew up visiting his grandparents’ home where pictures of relatives who had died at the hands of Hitler hung on the wall. In the Jewish mindset, they had died at the hands of Christians, so Dr. Glaser believed that Jesus and Christianity were the enemy.

Dr. Glaser’s traditional Orthodox upbringing included a bar mitzvah at age thirteen, visits to synagogue every Friday and Saturday, an interest in Jewish history, and a love for the Jewish Bible. However, while he loved being Jewish, he was not entirely sure about the religion.

After dropping out of college in 1970, Dr. Glaser moved to San Francisco, California with a friend, where they teamed up with two other Jewish young adults and began to sell drugs. It was one particular drug deal that changed Dr. Glaser’s perspective on life. The transaction escalated into a hostile situation, wherein Dr. Glaser decided that a few hundred dollars was not worth losing his life.

It was around this time that Dr. Glaser reunited with one of his friends from college who proudly proclaimed she had become a follower of Jesus. Despite his skepticism, Dr. Glaser followed her to Oregon, where he attended a Christian service. He did not understand why they bowed their heads, held hands, and began to pray as though they were actually talking to God. Suddenly the belligerent attitude he had arrived with began to melt away. He sensed a unique presence in the room that was palpable.

Dr. Glaser returned to California and began to pray, “God, if you are really there, show me.” One night, while visiting a payphone to make call, a beam of light from the moon revealed a small, New Testament Bible near the phone. He took it with him, believing that it was an answer to his prayer.

The more he read the New Testament, Dr. Glaser realized that Jesus was not antisemitic as he had long thought—He was Jewish Himself—and must be the Messiah that the Jewish people had been waiting for.

Growing up, the images he had seen of Jesus on the cross seemed like someone who was helpless, but in reading the New Testament, Dr. Glaser became acquainted with a strong, powerful Jesus and was drawn to Him. He fell in love with the way Jesus told stories, always taking His listeners deeper, to the heart of the matter.

In learning more about his Messiah, Dr. Glaser also became more aware of his sin. He asked God to forgive him, learning that believing in Jesus means believing He died for our sins.

Dr. Glaser received Jesus into his heart in November 1970.

Almost immediately after becoming a believer, he became involved with what was then the West Coast branch of Chosen People Ministries (formerly known as the American Board of Missions to the Jews). This was the beginning of a forty-five-year ministry that has included working with Jews for Jesus and Ariel Ministries. Since 1997, Dr. Glaser has served as president of Chosen People Ministries—one of the oldest and largest Messianic missions in the United States, established in 1894 by a Hungarian immigrant, Rabbi Leopold Cohn. Today, Chosen People Ministries is worldwide with missionaries in nineteen countries around the world including the United States, Russia, Germany, and Israel.

Founded in 1894 by Rabbi Leopold Cohn, Chosen People Ministries believes in the importance of the Big Apple on the global stage as it continues to hold the largest concentration of Jewish people of any metropolitan area in the world.

Today, Chosen People Ministries continues to be headquartered in New York City and has centers in both Brooklyn and Manhattan as well as serving in nineteen countries across the globe. Established outreach programs include evangelism and discipleship, Messianic centers and congregations, equipping the local church for Jewish evangelism, digital evangelism through the Isaiah 53 campaigns and I Found Shalom videos, and benevolence work. - **Evangelism and Discipleship:** Throughout the world, Chosen People Ministries proclaims the gospel and nurtures both new and mature believers so that they will grow in the Lord and use their gifts for His glory.
- **Messianic Centers:** The Messianic centers provide a setting for worship, Bible study, spiritual counseling, and practical help.
- **Messianic Congregations:** Jewish believers sometimes face rejection by their families, and they especially need the fellowship of those with a similar story. Messianic congregations satisfy this need and also lift up a witness in the community that Jesus is Lord, and one can be Jewish and believe in Him.

The Alliance for the Peace of Jerusalem

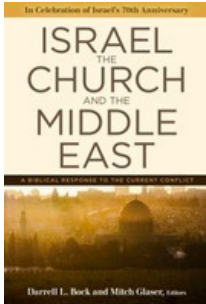
The Alliance for the Peace of Jerusalem is an organization dedicated to facilitating a better public understanding of the complexities of the Middle East including its roots in history and the Bible.

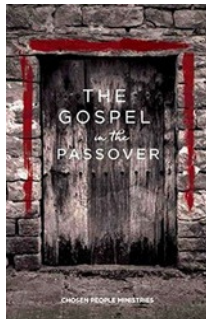


Title: *Israel, the Church, and the Middle East: A Biblical Response to the Current Conflict*

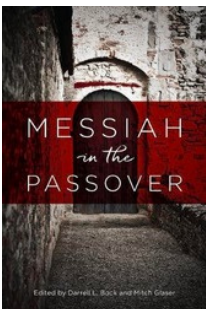


Title: *The Gospel in the Passover*

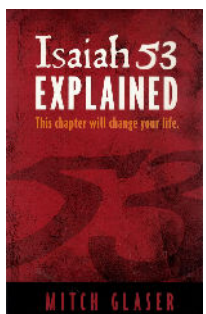


Title: *Messiah in the Passover*

Title: *Isaiah 53 Explained*

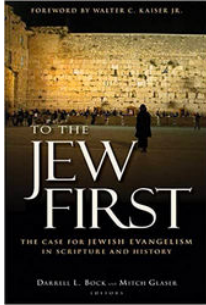

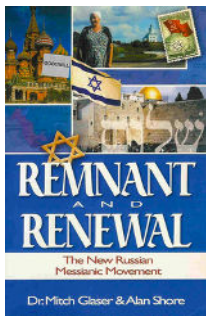


Title: *To the Jew First: The Case for Jewish Evangelism in Scripture and History*

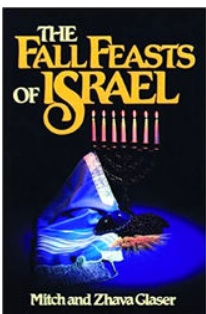


Title: *Remnant and Renewal: The New Russian Messianic Movement*
